FROM THE RABBI



Dear Friends,

As I continue to serve as your rabbi and stumble along my own life's journey, it becomes clearer and clearer to me that my desire is to help connect the meanderings of our journeys with the Jewish journey or the spiritual journey. I learn regularly that there is a synchronicity to life and now, it seems my challenge is to articulate and demonstrate that for myself and for others. My path in this effort takes many forms today.

Most recently, Kehilat HaNahar began both a beginner's Hebrew class and a Jewish Immersion class. The Hebrew class has been intentionally offered during Shul school so that adults who have never learned Hebrew or who are a bit rusty can join in Shul school and learn as our children learn. It is a class for adults; a crash course. Even though the small group of "students" has quite a good time together, and are earnest in their studies, I am quite surprised at how few enrolled. We try to create a community that has relevance, that is connected with our individual lives. The success of this does not lie on the shoulders of our leadership, or our committees, or even me. The success of this lies in your interest and participation. The study of Hebrew with or without your children is a way to connect the reality of Jewish life to contemporary life. It is one way to share as a family or as a community.

The Jewish Immersion class is the same. It evolved from two series of classes that were offered last year. This year's class probably should have been titled Spiritual Exploration because that is the focus of the curriculum. Given the times that we live in and the many people I have spoken with trying to find meaning in the chaos and challenges of our lives, I am surprised at the low enrollment in this class as well. So, I extend a new invitation to those of you wanting to explore the meaning of life, wanting to find kernels of meaning in the chaos that we create and experience, wanting to deepen spiritually. We are a diverse community; there is much wisdom among us. If we are to be a community of learners then it behooves us to all be students and teachers in the spiritual journey of life. If you are interested in joining this class, please let Kelly or me know. We are currently exploring the ancient and contemporary question: *Ayekah*, Where are you?, the question that God asked Adam in the Garden, the question that those of us who search spiritually continually ask. Where are you? Who am I? What am I doing in this precious life I've been given? How can I change or make a difference?

My spiritual meanderings have taken me down many paths over the past couple months. At the end of January, I participated in a meditation retreat. These retreats are life saving for me and truly help me to be able to do the work that I do in the world. The focus of this particular retreat was *Tikkun Olam/Tikkun Nefesh*... Healing the World, Healing the Soul. Utilizing the instruction in *Mishnah Brachot* to pay attention to the *neshamah*, to the soul breath, we spent most of our contemplative sessions trying to cultivate the capacity to be present, the capacity to witness the Presence of God, so that we may utilize that even in difficult or painful circumstances. It is only by developing the practices of *hesed*, kindness, and *rachamim*, compassion are we able to address the pain in our lives and in the world. Learning, as my meditation teacher has said, to develop minds of teflon not velcro.

I am reminded daily of the fact that a human being has a body, too. I once thought that my spirit and heart would be able to sustain me through all the trials that life presents. But recently, my body spoke up and I needed to surrender to its call. Pneumonia literally took my *neshamah*, my soul breath, away, forcing me to retreat in a different way. The experience profoundly taught me that if I don't take care of myself (which I often forget to do) I will be useless to that self and everyone else as well. Through illness I have learned gratitude... it is difficult for me to ask for help and to those of you who sent nourishment through meals, calls, cards and messages, I am grateful and touched beyond words. Thank you.

In March and April, as spring approaches, Purim marks the culmination of the Jewish calendrical cycle, the cycle that then begins again on Pesach, this year one month later. The rituals of each of these festivals occur in community. Will you participate in connecting your individual lives with Judaism by joining in the communal rituals of each these festivals? Whether it is in hearing Megillat Esther and playfully joining together for a Purim party, or retelling the story of the Exodus from Egypt as we journey through the seder, these festivals mark profound points in the individual and spiritual journey. They pose and help us explore *Ayekah*? Where are you in relationship to Judaism and finding meaning in your life?

Times have changed; we have changed; and we have grown; and so your Leadership is in the process of developing a new Long Range Plan for the years 2009--2013 (5769-5773). The first step in this vitally important process is the Tribal Council and all KHN committees providing their suggested plans for the next five (5) years. That's been completed.

In keeping with our participatory philosophy, we are now coming to you, our full membership, for your thoughts, ideas and suggestions in this very important undertaking. This is not just window dressing. We really need your input. You are what we are all about!

Sometime within the next two weeks a draft Long Range Plan will be posted on KHN's website. You can easily provide your input through accessing that site.

A summary of the draft Long Range Plan also will be posted in the foyer of the synagogue, and members of the Tribal Council will be available on Sunday mornings, March 9, March 16, and March 30 to discuss the draft plan with any and all members. Bagels, a schmeer and coffee will be available between 10 a.m. and 12 p.m., so please join us!

You also can call the Shul Office to request a hard copy. Kelly will be happy to accommodate you. (Given costs...it would be great, if you have a computer, to just download same...thanks).

Also any member of your Tribal Council will be glad to discuss the draft Long Range Plan with you. If you do have any specific questions, and in particular, procedural/process issues, just call Arthur at 215-794-2688.

We look forward with anticipation to your assistance and support as The Little Shul by the River, through this Long Range Plan, becomes an even more dynamic and vibrant religious and cultural presence here in the Delaware River Valley.

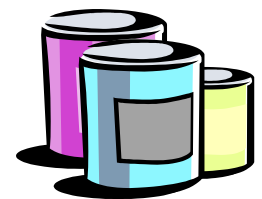
Little Shul Collects For Local Food Pantry

Middle East Dialogue to be Held as Part of Israel 60 Celebration

As part of this year's Israel 60 celebration, Kehilat HaNahar will host a dialogue session on the Middle East. Aided by facilitators from the Jewish Dialogue Organization, participants will have an opportunity to delve into individual and group viewpoints about the Israeli/Palestinian conflict and other issues facing the Middle East. This dialogue session is designed to provide an open, constructive chance for people to ask questions, share their beliefs, explore political differences, and learn from one another in an open, respectful environment.

"We have found that carefully structured and facilitated dialogue sessions — conversations that are set up to foster respectful listening and collective exploration, rather than argument and debate — can enable people to have

conversation that otherwise would not be possible," says Mitch Chanin from the Jewish Dialogue Organization.

Since Kehilat HaNahar prides itself on being a warm, welcoming place for people from many different backgrounds, experiences and beliefs, this seemed like the ideal way to discuss this most controversial topic.

The Middle East Dialogue Session will be held on Sunday, May 18. The evening will begin with a light supper at 6 p.m., followed by the dialogue session from 6:45-9 p.m. Space is limited.
