2. Participants will reconvene on Sunday January 15<sup>th</sup> at St. Martin of Tours Church SCHOOL Building, New Hope, PA to assemble the ingredients into meals for the homebound during the DVIC MLK DAY of Service.

You bet!

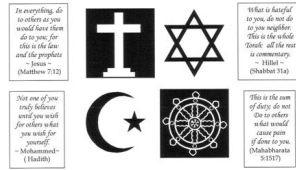

## Aid For Friends Meal Program



Aid For Friends Provides frozen home-cooked meals and friendly visiting to those who are isolated and homebound throughout the five county Philadelphia area.

DVIC congregations are asked to make meals, pack them in the containers available at DVIC Congregations as noted below and return them **FROZEN** on **SUNDAY, January 15<sup>th</sup>**. Each package will contain four containers; typically one family-sized entrée will fill these four meal containers. You can pick up as many packages of four as you think you can fill.

### WHAT YOU NEED TO DO

- ? Fill the three compartment tray with food: one entrée (meat or vegetarian), one vegetable, one starch
- ? Cover the tray with a piece of aluminum foil
- ? Fill out the menu sheet and date it
- ? Put the meal in the plastic bag with the menu inside
- ? Seal the bag with a twist tie
- ? Freeze it immediately
- ? Feel free to add some cookies in a small baggie on top
- ? Bring your frozen meals in their containers to the drop-off location as noted below. Make certain they are still **FROZEN!!**

### WHAT YOU SHOULD COOK

Traditional foods are best. The main compartment can be filled with meat, chicken, pasta or a casserole. The other two compartments should be filled with vegetable and/or a starch or fruit. Remember, soft foods are best as many of our clients have difficulty chewing. You can put a cookie on top of the meal wrapped inside the foil. Please fill the trays generously as for many, these are the only meals they have in a day.
